Bharat Bandh on SC quota order hits Bihar & tribal belts

It saw peaceful protests with sporadic incidents of violence

NEW DELHI/PATNA, 21 AUG

The daylong nationwide strike called by some Dalit and Adivasi groups against the Supreme Court's verdict on the sub-classification of Scheduled Castes affected normal life in Bihar and Jharkhand as well as tribal areas of various states.

The response was tepid in other parts of the country even as several INDIA bloc parties as well as other non-BJP outfits extended their support to the bandh.

The Chhattisgarh unit of the Congress said the government should consider the "legitimate demands" of the protesters sympathetically. However, the BJP's prominent tribal leader Faggan Singh Kulaste accused the opposition of politicising the Supreme Court's ruling on the issue.

Twenty-one organisations across the country had called for the Bharat Bandh against the apex court's order, which they said would harm the basic principles of reservation.

The RJD and other partners of the INDIA bloc extended their support to the bandh. Independent MP Rajesh

Ranjan alias Pappu Yadav, led demonstrations in Patna and other areas, criticising the NDA government's stance on SC/ST quota and alleging that it wants to undermine reservations.

In Patna, police chased away crowds who blocked traffic at Dak Bungalow Chowk. Some protesters tried to set a school bus on fire in Bihar, with kids inside the bus. Chief Minister Hemant Soren has cancelled his visit to Palamu on Wednesday due to the strike, an official said, adding security was bolstered at key locations to prevent any untoward incident.

"We are not protesting the top court's verdict. We hit the

streets to protect our rights provided by the Constitution," said Adivasi Jan Parishad president Prem Sahi Munda.

Rail and road communications were partially affected in Odisha but government offices, banks, business establishments and educational institu-

tions functioned normally. The call for the strike evoked a mixed response in Chhattisgarh, barring its tribal-dominated areas. Transport services largely remained unaffected in the rest of the state.

Other northern states, including Rajasthan, Punjab and Haryana, remained largely unaffected, barring a few places where markets remained closed and public transport services were partially affected.

1ST VISIT BY PM IN 45 YRS

PM arrives in Poland for 2-day visit

NEW DELHI, 21 AUG

Shortly before he embarked on a two-nation visit of Poland and Ukraine, Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Wednesday said he was looking forward to sharing perspectives with President Volodymyr Zelenskyy on a peaceful resolution of the Ukraine conflict.

People familiar with preparations for Modi's trip to Ukraine said he is expected to have a "candid" conversation with Zelenskyy and the ongoing conflict will form a major part of the discussion.

His visit to Kyiv comes nearly six weeks after his high-profile trip to Moscow during which he held extensive talks with Russian President Vladimir Putin on ending the

ongoing conflict. It is expected that during talks in Kyiv, the Indian side would refer to its talks with President Putin last month as part of overall efforts to help passing messages between the two sides, the people cited above said. Modi will be in Kyiv for around seven hours on Friday in the first visit by an Indian Prime Minister to Ukraine since the country became independent in 1991.

Meanwhile, Moscow came under one of the largest attacks yet by Ukrainian drones since the start of fighting in 2022. Russian authorities reported Wednesday, saying they destroyed all of those headed toward the capital.

IAF jet drops unidentified object near Pokhran

JAIPUR, 21 AUG

An object fell from an IAF fighter aircraft in the Pokhran area of Rajasthan's Jaipur district on Wednesday. The incident occurred in an isolated area and there was no damage to life or property, authorities said. "An inadvertent release of an air store from an Indian Air Force (IAF) fighter aircraft took place near Pokhran firing range area, due to technical malfunction, today," the Indian Air Force (IAF) posted on X. IAF did not reveal the exact nature of the object. Sub-inspector of Ramdevra police station Shankar Lal said some people heard a loud bang about a kilometre away from the village following which they rushed to the spot. —PTI

Fire breaks out at Andhra pharma unit, 17 dead

ATCHUTAPURAM, 21 AUG

The death toll in the fire accident at a pharmaceutical unit here on Wednesday rose to 17, officials said.

Anakapalli District Collector Vijaya Krishnan said the fire broke out at 2.15pm at Escientia Advanced Sciences Pvt Ltd at Atchutapuram in Anakapalli district.

"The factory operates with 381 employees in two shifts. The blast occurred during lunch time. Therefore, staff presence was less, Krishnan told PTI, adding that the explosion is suspected to be electricity-related.

As many as 33 injured people were shifted to different hospitals in Anakapalli and Atchutapuram while the Fire Department is engaged in rescue operations, deploying six fire tenders.

Further, the collector said 13 people trapped in the unit were rescued.

Meanwhile, Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu expressed grief over the loss of lives.

He assured that the government will stand by the families of the workers who died, said an official press release. —PTI

Badlapur sexual assault: 300 FIRs registered, over 40 held

BADLAPUR, 21 AUG

Maharashtra Police has arrested more than 40 people and registered First Information Report (FIR) against 300 people following the massive protest over the alleged sexual assault of two minor girls in Badlapur, that led to stone-pelting, disruption of train services and lathi-charge on Tuesday.

The arrested people will be presented in court on Wednesday. Maharashtra police have also heightened the security at the railway station as police personnel have been deployed at the railway station to ensure no repetition of Tuesday's outbreak.

CHINTAMANI, 21 AUG

A 24-year-old youth arrested for allegedly raping a 65-year-old woman in Chintamani, on Wednesday.

The accused has been identified as Irfan, 25, resident of Hyderali Nagar in Chintamani and the incident took place at around 2.30am in the hospital premises. According to Dr Santosh Kumar, Administrative Officer of General hospital, the incident took place near the oxygen plant in the compound. Santosh said the victim who resides in a nearby village probably had missed the bus to the village and was taking shelter near the shed. —Salar News

Tribal woman gangraped in Ch'garh RAIGARH, 21 AUG

A 27-year-old tribal woman was raped allegedly by six men in Raigarh district of Chhattisgarh, police said on Wednesday. The incident took place on Monday in a village under Pusaur police station area when the victim was on her way to visit a local fair after celebrating Rakshabandhan festival, a police official here said. As per the complaint, some people allegedly intercepted her and forcibly took her to the bank of a nearby pond and raped her there. —PTI

No lawyer for Kolkata rape accused KOLKATA, 21 AUG

The process of conducting a polygraph test on Sanjoy Ray, a 33-year-old civic volunteer accused of raping and murdering a 31-year-old doctor at Kolkata's RG Kar Medical College and Hospital has been delayed due to the absence of legal representation for Ray. The district court in Sealdah granted permission for the test marking a critical step in verifying Ray's statements.

151 MPs, MLAs accused of crimes against women

NEW DELHI, 21 AUG

As many as 151 sitting MPs and MLAs have declared cases related to crimes against women in their election affidavits, with West Bengal having the highest number of lawmakers facing such cases, according to a recent report by a poll rights body.

For the report, the Association for Democratic Reforms examined 4,693 out of 4,809 affidavits of sitting MPs and MLAs submitted to the Election Commission of India during elections between 2019

and 2024. The organisation identified 16 MPs and 135 MLAs facing cases related to crimes against women. West Bengal tops the list

with 25 sitting MPs and MLAs facing charges related to crimes against women, followed by Andhra Pradesh with 21 and Odisha with 17, according to the report that comes amid the nationwide protests over the alleged rape and murder of a trainee doctor in a state-run hospital in Kolkata and sexual assault of two children in Thane. According to the report, there are 16 sitting MPs and MLAs who have declared cases related to rape under Indian Penal Code (IPC) section 376, which carries a minimum sentence

of 10 years and can be extended to life imprisonment. Of these, two are MPs and 14 MLAs.

Charges include repeated offenses against the same victim, underscoring the gravity of these cases. Among political parties, BJP has the highest number of representatives (54 MPs and MLAs) with declared cases related to crimes against women, followed by Congress with 23 and Telugu Desam Party (TDP) with 17, according to the report.

Both BJP and Congress have five sitting lawmakers each facing rape charges. —PTI

Online food delivery platform Zomato will acquire Paytm's entertainment ticketing business Paytm Insider for Rs 2,048 crore to strengthen its "going-out" segment in a deal that will help the troubled fintech firm to sharpen its focus on core payments and financial services distribution. Paytm Insider covers movies, sports, and events.

The boards of Zomato and One 97 Communications Ltd (OCL) have approved the all-cash deal. —PTI

Bullet-proof car for K'taka Governor amid protests

BENGALURU, 21 AUG

In the wake of violent state-wide protests condemning Karnataka Governor Thawarchand Gehlot's grant of permission to prosecute Chief Minister Siddaramaiah, the state constitutional head's security has been tightened, Raj Bhavan sources said on Wednesday. He has also started using a bullet-proof car since Tuesday morning. "All the governors, by virtue of holding gubernatorial posts, are entitled to Z-plus security. Till now, the governor was not using it because he did not feel the need for it but now his

In a shocking incident in Puttur, Dakshina Kannada, a girl was assaulted by a fellow student who reportedly had a crush on her.

According to Superintendent of Police Yathish N, the attack occurred on Tuesday morning when the girl was on her way to college. The boy, known to the victim, approached her and, after his advances were rejected, attacked her with a weapon, injuring her hand. The victim is currently receiving treatment at the government hospital.

A case has been registered at the DK Women's Police Station under case number 42/2024, invoking sections 78, 126(2), 118(1), 238 BNS 2023, and section 12 of the POCSO Act. —ANI

K'taka Bank, Navi Tech launch credit line on UPI

NEW DELHI, 21 AUG

Karnataka Bank and financial services company Navi Technologies have announced the launch of credit line on UPI, an offering by the National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI). The private sector lender will be offering credit lines through a strategic partnership with Navi, marking Karnataka Bank as one of the early adopters of this next-gen credit product. "This is currently offered to a closed group of select users who are pre-qualified for the product, and it will be launched to more users based on customer feedback," a release said. It further said the bank is starting with a short-term monthly loan product and is in discussions for adding other variants, like EMI facilities, and working capital credit lines in the future, aligned to customers evolving needs. Sekhar Rao, executive director of the bank, said by integrating a credit line directly into the UPI ecosystem, "we are making it easier than ever for our customers to access credit in a secure and convenient manner". —PTI

Cylinders explode in Shivamogga, no casualties

SHIVAMOGGA, 21 AUG

A fire broke out in a bakery at Ayanur in Shivamogga district following which two cylinders at the eatery exploded on Wednesday, police sources said. The incident occurred in the afternoon and no casualties were reported, they said. The fire brigade rushed to the spot and doused the fire. A short circuit in a refrigerator is suspected to be the cause of the fire. Two commercial gas cylinders blew up due to the blaze, the sources added. The video of the incident has gone viral in which people are seen running helter-skelter after the explosion. —PTI

War of words breaks out between CM & HDK

Controversy is over Gov's sanction to prosecute Siddaramaiah

BENGALURU, 21 AUG

A war of words has broken out between Karnataka Chief Minister Siddaramaiah and Union Minister HD Kumaraswamy over the Lokayukta's Special Investigation Team (SIT) seeking Governor's sanction to prosecute the latter in an alleged illegal mining lease case.

Siddaramaiah told reporters at Ganigera in Koppal district on Wednesday that he has not said anywhere that Kumaraswamy would be arrested in connection with the case.

But the Chief Minister added: "If there is a circumstance (in connection with the case) to arrest him, we will arrest him without any hesitation. Such a circumstance is not there now. He is now scared that the Governor (Thaawarchand Gehlot) will give sanction," the Chief Minister said. "If he is not scared, he would not have held a press meet today."

Hitting back at the Chief

Minister, Kumaraswamy told reporters here: "100 Siddaramaiahs should come (to arrest him). Do you think so (I am scared) when you see me?"

Responding to this, the Chief Minister said: "It's not 100 Siddaramaiahs...It's the police who arrest Kumaraswamy...not me...one constable is enough to arrest him. Even if 100 Siddaramaiahs

come, arrest can't be made. I am not arresting... arrest is done by police."

Siddaramaiah charged the Governor Thaawarchand Gehlot with indulging in discrimination while approving prosecution sanction requests.

The SIT has once again submitted a proposal to the Governor on Monday seeking permission to file a charge-sheet against Kumaraswamy

in the alleged mining lease case.

The SIT had first requested Gehlot's nod in November last year to prosecute the Union Minister for Heavy Industries and Steel, who had allegedly granted mining lease to Sri Sai Venkateshwara Minerals when he was the Chief Minister in 2007 in violation of law.

The Chief Minister also dubbed Kumaraswamy a "hit and run case".

Siddaramaiah alleged that Kumaraswamy, a former Chief Minister, had levelled many allegations but not taken any of them to "logical end".

On Tuesday, Siddaramaiah had also said the Governor did not give permission to the Lokayukta to prosecute former BJP ministers Shashikala Jolle, Muruges Niran and G Janardhana Reddy.

Siddaramaiah has termed as "trumped-up" the allegations of irregularities in the allotment of sites to his wife Parvathi by the MUDA. —PTI

Tejasvi Surya writes to DKS on traffic woes in Bengaluru

BENGALURU, 21 AUG

BJP MP Tejasvi Surya on Wednesday highlighted the traffic woes of Bengaluru city, saying that we are spending more time in mind-numbing traffic than with our family and loved ones.

He also called on Deputy Chief Minister DK Shivakumar who is also Bengaluru incharge Minister to convene an urgent meeting with elected representatives and traffic management experts to address the issue.

According to the South Bengaluru MP, "The traffic scene in Bengaluru is getting more distressing every passing day. Even Sundays, which used to be relatively easier, is

becoming as nightmarish as the weekdays."

He said, "Every day, we are adding thousands of new private vehicles onto the roads which is only adding to the problem. Even running errands from neighbourhood stores takes so much time. The city roads, including the small lanes in residential areas, are way beyond its carrying

capacity, and there is no space to make more roads. Anyway, more roads mean more private vehicles."

"Successive governments in the State, across parties, have failed to provide our wonderful city the vision and leadership that it deserves," the BJP MP added.

"Something drastic has to be done to address this. And it needs to be done NOW, with warlike urgency. In the long term, we need to double down on our investments and urgency on public transportation and drastically reduce private vehicles. Each person owning a private vehicle model will simply not work for a densely populated country like ours," Surya added. —ANI

Pralhad Joshi to lay EV unit foundation in City

BENGALURU, 21 AUG

Union Minister Pralhad Joshi will on Thursday lay the foundation stone for an Electric Vehicle (EV) testing facility at the National Test House (NTH) in Bengaluru.

The facility will have equipment capable of conducting various tests on EV batteries, including electrical safety, electromagnetic compatibility (EMC), functional safety, durability, climate, and mechanical and material tests, an official statement said.

It will serve as a comprehensive centre for testing various aspects of EVs, ensuring that vehicles meet stringent quality standards before reaching consumers. This is expected to be a significant boon for southern India's EV manufacturers.

The National Test House, which operates under the aegis of the Department of Consumer Affairs, is a premier scientific organization that has been at the forefront of testing and quality assurance in various

fields, including the Jal Jeevan Mission, Bullet Train project, Metro projects, and drone certification.

In addition to the EV testing facility, the occasion will also see the NTH provide an OIML approved certificate, accepted worldwide, to Tatsuno India, a manufacturer of dispensing units for petrol pumps. The new EV testing facility is expected to further enhance the developing ecosystem of electric vehicles in India and provide vital support to the EV industry, contributing to the broader goals of environmental sustainability and innovation in automotive technology. —PTI

DKS says repair of Tungabhadra gate answered critics

BENGALURU/KOPPAL, 21 AUG

Deputy Chief Minister DK Shivakumar on Wednesday said quick and efficient repair of the damaged crest gate of Tungabhadra Dam has saved water and answered critics in a befitting manner.

"Criticisms die and good work lives on. The crest gate was repaired in just four days. Technicians, officials, engineers, workers, MLAs and district-in-charge minister burnt the midnight oil to fix the damaged crest gate at the dam," he said. "The government will honour each of them."

Asked if Tungabhadra Dam has a low lifespan, "There is no issue at all. Half a TMC of silt settle every year. (Industries Minister) MB Patil had spoken about it in the past. We will work on the Navali balancing reservoir as well. This project was included in the budget." —Salar News

4 OF RAMJI NAGAR GANG HELD FOR THEFTS

Indiranagar police have arrested four members of Ramji Nagar gang hailing from Trichy in Tamil Nadu for stealing valuables, including laptops, from vehicles in Bengaluru.

Police recovered seven laptops and other valuables valued at Rs 5.85 lakh and also chilli powder and weapons from the gang which struck the City after three years.

The arrested are Murugan, 38, Senthil, 50, Murthy, 49 and John, 35, and two others part of the gang escaped the police net. The gang would keep a watch on parked cars and break the windshields and rob valuables such as laptops and mobile phones and sell them to John who was their main buyer of stolen goods, police said.

A police team went to Tamil Nadu to recover the weapons and John was nabbed near Attibele bus stop on 15 August.

In 2021, City police nabbed 11 members of the gang, following which 42 cases were solved. —Salar News

The DC then decided to facilitate a platform for the sale of these plants, and thus enabling the inmates to contribute to society in a meaningful way. The plant sale centre, situated right at the entrance of the jail, is a collaborative effort involv-

ing multiple departments such as the Municipal Corporation and Forest Department.

Speaking at the inauguration event, DC Mugilan said, "This sales centre is a step forward in encouraging such efforts, offering inmates a chance to engage in productive and transformative activities."

One of the inmates who took an active part in developing this nursery told PTI that the project is a reminder that even behind bars, there is room for growth, learning, and a second chance at life. Principal District and Sessions Judge Ravindra M Joshi presided over the inaugural function, commending the initiative as a model for prisoner rehabilitation.

Centre accords Z+ security cover to Sharad Pawar

India's plan to procure 31 MQ-9B Predator drones, the proposed joint manufacturing of Stryker infantry combat vehicles and co-production of GE F414 engines in India are likely to figure prominently in Singh's talks with Austin, officials said Tuesday. Singh will chair a high-level roundtable meeting with the US defence industry on the ongoing and future defence collaborations. "The visit is expected to further deepen and broaden the India-US Comprehensive Global Strategic Partnership." —PTI

A former deputy superintendent of RG Kar Medical College and Hospital on Wednesday moved the Calcutta High Court, seeking an ED investigation against its ex-principal Sandip Ghosh, alleging financial irregularities by him during his tenure at the state-run facility. Calcutta High Court on Wednesday adjourned till September 4 the joint hearing

of several PILs over the alleged rape and murder of a doctor in RG Kar Medical College and Hospital and vandalism by miscreants at the institution since the Supreme Court is already seized of the matter. The Kolkata Police has suspended three of its officers in connection with the vandalism at RG Kar Medical College and Hospital here last week, officials said. The suspended policemen include two assistant police commissioners, they said. A group of people had entered the medical facility and vandalised its emergency department, nursing station, and medicine store in the early hours of 15 August. —PTI

Protests sing streets, CBI grills Ghosh for 6th day

KOLKATA, 21 AUG

Protestors from across walks of life, who joined in solidarity with the ongoing junior doctors' agitation against the alleged rape and murder of the RG Kar Medical College and Hospital medic, on Wednesday took the streets of Kolkata and beyond by storm, even as public health-care in West Bengal continued to remain sorely affected. Senior doctors, nurses and wannabe medics from across medical colleges of the state, numbering a few thousand, conducted a march to the state health department headquarters, Shwasthya Bhavan, and laid siege to the premises till representatives of protestors met the department's top officials and submitted a memorandum. Coming out of the meeting, the protesting doctors said they were "deeply disappointed" with the demeanour of the officials. CBI, meanwhile, grilled Sandip Ghosh for the sixth day.. —PTI

Massive protests broke out in Badlapur, 53 km from Mumbai, on Tuesday after a school attendant was arrested for allegedly sexually abusing two kindergarten girls. A local court on Wednesday extended till 26 August the

police custody of the man arrested for allegedly sexually abusing two girls at a school in Badlapur town of Maharashtra's Thane district. Badlapur school, where two young girls were allegedly sexually abused, preferred to cover up the crime instead of helping their parents file a police complaint, said Susieban Shah, chairperson of Maharashtra State Commission for Protection of Child Rights, on Wednesday. The alleged crime by a male attendant created a volatile situation in the town of Thane district on Tuesday, with protesting parents and locals crippling rail services and clashing with police. —PTI

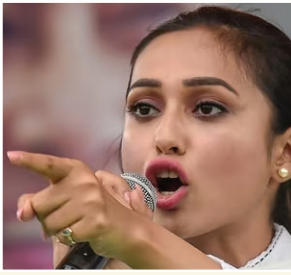

The 31-member committee, headed by BJP member Jagdambika Pal, has been tasked by the Lok Sabha to scrutinise the contentious bill, which has drawn protests from the Opposition parties and Muslim organisations. The representatives from the

through a centralised portal. It proposes several reforms, including establishing a Central Waqf Council alongside state Waqf Boards with representation to the Muslim women and non-Muslim representatives. The Bill was introduced in the Lok Sabha on 8 August and referred to a joint committee of Parliament after a heated debate, with the government asserting that the proposed law did not intend to interfere with the functioning of mosques and the opposition calling it a targeting of Muslims and an attack on the Constitution. —PTI

Behera had been in the ICU since Monday night and had underlying health conditions, including diabetes and high blood pressure. Meanwhile, the family members of the deceased and villagers staged a road blockade at Chikiti demanding compensation of Rs 20 lakh. —PTI

NSA invoked against man for thrashing tribal
INDORE, 21 AUG
 The district administration in Madhya Pradesh's Indore has invoked the stringent National Security Act (NSA) against a miscreant arrested for publicly beating a 22-year-old tribal man and forcing him to tie his shoe laces, an official said on Wednesday. Accused Ritesh Rajput, 28, from an area under the Bhawarkuan police station limits, thrashed and tortured the tribal man on 18 August following a dispute over driving properly on the road, Deputy Commissioner of Police (DCP) Rishikesh Meena said. The absconding co-accused in the case has been identified as Rohit Rathore and a search was on to nab him, he said. —PTI

HC extends interim protection of Khedkar till 29 Aug
NEW DELHI, 21 AUG
 Delhi High Court on Wednesday extended the interim protection from arrest for suspended trainee IAS officer Pooja Khedkar. The extension remains in effect till 29 August. Former trainee IAS officer Puja Khedkar is accused of falsifying and misrepresenting facts in her application to the Union Public Service Commission (UPSC). The court had instructed the investigation agency not to arrest her while the matter is under consideration, noting that immediate arrest is not deemed necessary. Justice Subramonium Prasad of the Delhi High Court has deferred the hearing to 29 August. The deferral was due to the Delhi Police's reply not being filed on record yet. Senior Advocate Siddharth Luthra, representing Khedkar, also requested additional time to review the UPSC's response. —ANI

Pigeon fails to fly during 1-day event in Ch'garh
RAIPUR, 21 AUG

HC allows gamete extraction from critically ill husband

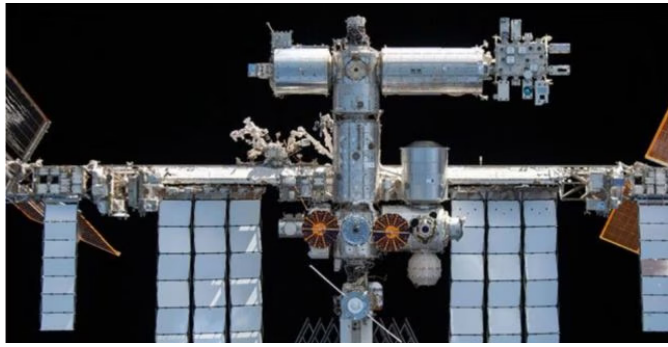
KOCHI, 21 AUG

Kerala High Court has come to the aid of a childless couple where the husband is critically ill, by permitting extraction of his gametes and cryopreserving them for use by his wife to undergo Assisted Reproductive Technology procedure for conceiving a child. Justice VG Arun granted the interim relief on the wife's plea without the consent of her husband, a requirement under the Assisted

Reproductive Technology (ART) Regulation Act, as his medical condition was critical and was worsening day-by-day. The wife had, in her plea, sought permission to extract and cryopreserve the gametes of her husband. Her lawyers told the court that it was impossible to get informed written consent of the husband and if the matter was delayed any further, the worst may happen. "Taking the above factors

into consideration, and being guided by equity in the absence of an enabling statutory provision, I find the 1st petitioner (wife) to be entitled for the interim relief sought. The court made it clear that other than extraction and preservation of the gametes, no further procedure under the ART Regulation Act shall be undertaken without its permission. It listed the matter for further hearing on 9 September. —PTI

Indian astronaut likely to fly to Int'l Space Station by April 2025

An Indian astronaut is likely to fly to the International Space Station by April next year as part of the NASA-ISRO collaborative initiative, Science and Technology Minister Jitendra Singh said on Wednesday. Two Indian astronaut-designates Group Captains Shubhanshu Shukla and Prashanth Balakrishnan Nair are undergoing training in the US for the Axiom Space Ax-4 mission. ISRO has assigned Shukla for the Ax-4 mission while Nair would be the back-up candidate.

The theme for the National Space Day is 'Touching Lives while Touching the Moon: India's Space Saga'. On the occasion, ISRO will release on 23 August the scientific data collected by the Chandrayaan-3 mission that could be used by researchers. More than one thousand events have been organised across the country over the last two months. The Chandrayaan-4 mission is expected to be launched in 2027 subject to approval from the government, he said, adding the aim of the mission was to bring back samples of lunar rock and soil to Earth. —PTI

TN HAS GARNERED RS 9.74L CR NEW INVESTMENTS: CM

CHENNAI, 21 AUG

Tamil Nadu has attracted investments worth over Rs 9 lakh crore in the last three years and generated 31 lakh new jobs, Chief Minister MK Stalin said on Wednesday. Ahead of his visit to the United States next week to woo investors, Stalin on Wednesday unveiled a slew of new projects worth Rs 68,773 crore that would generate 1 lakh jobs in the state. "This is a very important day in the industrial and development history of Tamil Nadu. It is a day to showcase our economic prowess to the world — and a day to realise that Tamil Nadu has a bright future," the Chief Minister said at the Tamil Nadu Investment Conclave here. The projects unveiled by CM include the inauguration of 19 new projects worth Rs 17,616 crore and laying the foundation stone for 28 different projects valued at Rs 51,157 crore, he said. The commitments made by companies include ones that Stalin received on his overseas trip to attract investments, those commitments received by companies between 2021 and 2023 and also those received during Global Investors' Meet held in January this year. —PTI

India's 2nd 700 MW nuclear plant starts full capacity ops

NEW DELHI, 21 AUG

India's second home-built 700 MW nuclear power reactor at Kakrapar Atomic Power Station (KAPS) in Gujarat on Wednesday started operating at its full capacity, the plant operator said. The Nuclear Power Corporation of India Limited (NPCIL) said Unit 4 at KAPS had been operating at 90 per cent capacity before raising it to full power of 700 MWe. The KAPS-4 unit achieved first criticality on 17 December last year and commenced commercial operations on 31

The police have launched an investigation into the incident and the accused is yet to be arrested. —Agencies

Tripura man returns after 37 yrs in B'desh jails

AGARTALA, 21 AUG

A man from Tripura's Sepahijala district returned home after spending 37 years in Bangladesh jails. Shahjahan returned to India through the Srimantapur land customs station with the assistance of BSF personnel. Shahjahan, a resident of Rabindranagar, a border village in Sonamura subdivision, had gone to his in-law's house in Comilla, Bangladesh, in 1988. During his visit, police raided his relative's home and arrested him for illegally entering the neighbouring country, officials said. "At the age of 25, I was sentenced to 11 years in prison by a court in Comilla. Despite completing my sentence, I was not released and spent an additional 26 years in custody, totaling 37 years before I was allowed to return home," Shahjahan told reporters. The injustice faced by Shahjahan came to light a few months ago through media reports. His plight attracted the attention of the Zara Foundation, an organisation dedicated to helping immigrants who become trapped. He also alleged that he endured brutal torture during his initial 14 days in police custody. —PTI

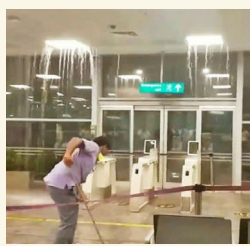

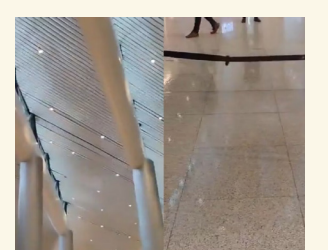

All I can do now is get her justice: Rape victim's father

The father of the trainee doctor murdered during a rest break at a Kolkata hospital has spoken of his daughter's love of medicine and the way her family had worked to support her vocation. "We are a poor family and we raised her with a lot of hardship. She worked extremely hard to become a doctor. All she did was study, study, study," he told the Guardian by telephone. "All our dreams have been shattered in one night. We sent her to work and the hospital gave us her body. It's all finished for us. "My daughter isn't coming back. I'm never going to hear her voice or laugh. All I can do now is concentrate on getting her justice," he said. The rape and murder of the doctor at RG Kar hospital in Kolkata on 9 August, and subsequent handling of the case by the authorities, has led to protests and strikes by doctors across India. Her father, who cannot be named under an Indian law that protects the identity of the dead woman, said a career in medicine was all his only child had ever wanted. The 31-year-old had beaten the odds to qualify for one of approximately

107,000 places in India's medical colleges, which more than a million aspiring doctors compete for every year. She won a place at College of Medicine & JNM hospital in Kalyani in her home state of West Bengal. Her parents financed her dream with the precarious income her father earned as a tailor. Remembering the day she confided in him she wanted to become a doctor, his voice broke. "She said: 'Papa, it's a good thing to become a doctor and help others. What do you think?' I said: 'OK, do it. We'll help you.' And look what happened," he said. Her ambition drove him to expand his tailoring business and the family's finances improved to the point where, when his daughter fretted about safety on the hour-long bus ride between the hospital and their home in a crowded Kolkata suburb, he was able to borrow the money to buy her a car. "At first, she told me to wait, she said we couldn't manage the EMIs [monthly instalments] and she didn't want to overburden us. But then she found the bus ride so tiring after a long shift that she agreed to the car," said the

father. Although they remained in the same lower middle-class suburb where she grew up, and where everyone respected her as a local girl made good, her parents had recently renovated the house. The brass nameplate bore her name, not theirs, proudly prefixed by "Dr.". The sense of disbelief in the neighbourhood has not faded since the news spread from house to house that "their" doctor's bright day was done. The location of this attack - in the hospital where the victim worked, which she and her family assumed was safe - and her public service as a doctor working a 36-hour shift have added to the public outrage over the crime. The father said: "Like all parents, we worried about her safety but only while she was travelling. The moment she reached the hospital, we relaxed. She was safe. It's like when we used to drop her off at school - once she was inside the gate, you feel she is safe," he said. In a post on X, the head of the Indian Medical Association, Dr RV Asokan, expressed anguish at the murder, saying "we failed her in life but did not fail her in death" - a reference to

the protests, outcry and doctors' strikes that have rocked the country since her body was discovered. Her colleagues and neighbours describe a dedicated young doctor who wanted to pay off her parents' debts and give them a comfortable life after their sacrifices to help her become a doctor. One of her former teachers, Arnab Biswas, said that unlike many young people who chose medicine for its earning potential, she was "old school", treating it as a vocation. Having witnessed Covid-19 patients gasping for breath, she selected respiratory medicine when it came to choosing a medical specialism. Her parents are broken. "She was my only child. We worked hard to make her a doctor ... I will never be happy again," a neighbour said the mother told her. Neighbours, who consulted her over every ailment and were proud of her achievements, recall her feeding stray animals and gardening when she had the time. They are yearning to help the family in some way. "The girl has gone now," said one neighbour. "But we'll stand by her parents so they don't feel alone." Courtesy, —The Guardian

The chaos of 'overtourism' in the summer of 2024

The doorbell to Martinho de Almada Pimentel's house is hard to find, and he likes it that way. It's a long rope that, when pulled, rings a literal bell on the roof that lets him know someone is outside the mountainside mansion that his great-grandfather built in 1914 as a monument to privacy. There's precious little of that for Pimentel during this summer of "overtourism."

Travelers idling in standstill traffic outside the sun-washed walls of Casa do Cipreste in Cintra sometimes spot the bell and pull the string "because it's funny," he says. With the windows open, he can smell the car exhaust and hear the "tuk-tuk" of outsized scooters named for the sound they make. And he can sense the frustration of 5,000 visitors a day who are forced to queue around the house on the crawl up single-lane switchbacks to Pena Palace, the onetime retreat of King Ferdinand II. "Now I'm more isolated than during Covid," the soft-spoken Pimentel, who lives alone, said during an interview this month on the veranda. "Now I try to (not) go out. What I feel is: angry."

This is a story of what it means to be visited in 2024, the first year in which global tourism is expected to set records since the coronavirus pandemic brought much of life on Earth to a halt. Wandering is surging, rather than leveling off, driven by lingering revenge travel, digital nomad campaigns and so-called golden visas blamed in part for skyrocketing housing prices. Cue the violins, you might grouch, for people like Pimentel who are well-off enough to live in places worth visiting. But it's more than a problem for rich people. "Not to be able to get an ambulance or to not be able to get my groceries is a rich people problem?" said Matthew Bedell, another resident of Sintra, which has no pharmacy or grocery store in the center of the UNESCO-designated district. "Those don't feel like rich people problems to me."

none more universal than housing prices driven up by short-term rentals like Airbnb, from Spain to South Africa. The summer of 2023 was defined by the frustration of the journey itself - airports and airlines overwhelmed, passports a nightmare for travelers from the US. Yet by the end of the year, signs abounded that the Covid-19 rush of revenge travel was accelerating. In January, the United Nations' tourism agency predicted that worldwide tourism would exceed the records set in 2019 by 2 per cent. By the end of March, the agency reported, more than 285 million tourists had travelled internationally, about 20 per cent more than the first quarter of 2023. The World Travel and Tourism Council projected in April that 142 of 185 countries it analysed would set records for tourism, set to generate USD 11.1 trillion globally and account for 330 million jobs. Aside from the money, there's been trouble in paradise this year, with Spain playing a starring role in everything from water management problems to skyrocketing housing prices and drunken tourist drama. Protests erupted across the country as early as March, with thousands of people demonstrating in Spain's Canary Islands against visitors and construction that was overwhelming water services and jacking up housing prices. Japan set records for tourist arrivals. In Fujikawaguchiko, a town that offers some of the best views of Mt Fuji, leaders erected a large black screen in a parking lot to deter tourists from overcrowding the site. The tourists apparently struck back by cutting holes in the screen at eye level. Air travel, meanwhile, only got more miserable, the US government reported in July. Tourism is surging and

shifting so quickly, in fact, that some experts say the very term "overtourism" is outdated. "There's been backlash against the business models on which modern tourism has been built and the lack of response by politicians," he said in an interview. Tourism "came back quicker than we expected," he allows, but tourists aren't the problem. "So what happens when we get too many tourists? Destinations need to do more research." Virpi Makela can describe exactly what happens in her corner of Sintra. Incoming guests at Casa do Valle, her hillside bed-and-breakfast near the village center, call Makela in anguish because they cannot figure out how to find her property amid Sintra's "disorganized" traffic rules that seem to change without notice. "There's a pillar in the middle of the road that goes up and down and you can't go forward because you ruin your car. So you have to somehow come down but you can't turn around, so you have to back down the road," says Makela, a resident of Portugal for 36 years. "And then people get so frustrated they come to our road, which also has a sign that says 'authorized vehicles only.' And they block everything." A 40-minute train ride to the west, Sintra's municipality has invested in more parking lots outside town and youth housing at lower prices near the center, the mayor's office said. It's not enough, say local residents, who have organized into QSintra, an association that's challenging City Hall to "put residents first" with better communication, to start. They also want to know the government's plan for managing guests at a new hotel being constructed to increase the number of overnight stays, and more limits on the number of cars and visitors allowed. —AP

WHY IS MODI VISITING UKRAINE AFTER RUSSIA?

Kyiv is due to welcome Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi on August 23, on the eve of Ukrainian Independence Day, and just over a month after Modi visited Moscow. His visit is sure to evoke mixed feelings among his Ukrainian hosts. India has persevered in maintaining close ties to Russia despite the full-scale invasion of Ukraine in February 2022, at the cost of significant irritation to Kyiv and its allies. While Modi has called for peace, he has also refused to directly hold the Kremlin responsible for the war. This was also illustrated during Modi's trip to Russia in July and his meeting with President Vladimir Putin, which coincided with Moscow's deadly attack on a Ukrainian children's hospital. The Indian Prime Minister responded with a carefully worded comment. "When innocent children are killed, the heart bleeds and that pain is very terrifying," Modi said at the time.

and a devastating blow to peace efforts to see the leader of the world's largest democracy hug the world's most bloody criminal in Moscow on such a day," Zelenskyy wrote online. Now, Modi is set to make his first visit to Ukraine since the war began in February 2022, and the first visit by an Indian leader to Ukraine for about 30 years. "India has substantive and independent ties with both Russia and Ukraine and these partnerships stand on their own," Tanmaya Lal, Secretary (West) at the Indian Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) told reporters during a media briefing on Monday. **India wants peace talks** Experts say that this visit is a balancing act for India, which also gives New Delhi a chance to urge peace negotiations. But Indian diplomacy has to maintain a difficult balance. "Russia is a long-term traditional ally and Ukraine also has had very friendly relations with India. It is a difficult task to manage this, especially because Ukraine has received strong support from the West, with which India also has good relations," Rajiv Bhatia, former Indian ambassador, and a distinguished fellow at the Gateway House think tank,

Also, New Delhi is wary that alienating Moscow could push Russia closer to China, which is India's major rival in Asia. Complicating the geopolitical calculation even further, the US and other Western countries are irritated by Modi's Russia-friendly stance and by his meeting with Putin. However, the West also doesn't want India to lose its influence in Moscow, as India could serve as a counterbalance to China when trying to sway the Kremlin. **What will Modi do in Kyiv?** "India will try to project itself as a peacemaker and engage in humanitarian assistance," Amit Julka, an assistant professor of International Relations at Ashoka University, told DW. "Despite India's closeness to

the US, there are undercurrents of suspicion. The Ukraine visit will also serve as damage control in terms of the optics. While it enjoys close ties with Russia, India does not want to alienate the West," Julka said. India's Foreign Ministry said that New Delhi would not unveil a peace plan in Kyiv, but India was ready to support the negotiation of a peace settlement. **What else is on the agenda?** Apart from Russia's war on Ukraine, there are several other items on that Modi will likely discuss with Ukraine's President Volodymyr Zelenskyy. "Defence and economic cooperation, and the role of India in the eventual rebuilding of post-war Ukraine will also be discussed," said former ambassador Bhatia. "Modi is also likely to express gratitude towards the Ukrainian government for their help in evacuating Indian students after the war broke out," he added. Before the full-scale war in Ukraine, India had about 19,000 students enrolled in Ukrainian universities. Following the Russian invasion in February 2022, India, Ukraine and Poland worked together to evacuate most of them in a push dubbed "Operation Ganga." —DW News

Indian doctor held in US for taking pics of naked kids

WASHINGTON, 21 AUG
A 40-year-old Indian doctor was held in a US jail on a USD 2 million bond after being charged with multiple sex crimes for allegedly recording hundreds of nude images and videos of children and women over several years, according to media reports. Oumair Aejaz was arrested earlier on August 8 after he allegedly placed hidden cameras in a variety of settings from bathrooms, changing areas, hospital rooms, and even his own home where he would record children as young as 2 years old in varying states of undress. Authorities became aware of his offences after his wife came forward with disturbing materials. Several search warrants have been served since Aejaz was arrested on 8 August at his home. —AP

Australia greenlights \$19B solar project

NEWCASTLE, 21 AUG
An ambitious plan to build a massive solar farm in remote northern Australia that would transmit energy by submarine cable to Singapore is a step closer after the Australian government granted environmental approvals for the USD 19 billion project Wednesday. Australian company Sun Cable plans to build a 12,400-hectare solar farm and transport electricity to the northern Australian city of Darwin via an 800km overhead transmission line, then on to large-scale industrial customers in Singapore through a 4,300km submarine cable. The Australia-Asia PowerLink project aims to deliver up to six gigawatts of green electricity each year. —AP

Houthi target commercial ship in Red Sea

DUBAI, 21 AUG
A commercial ship traveling through the Red Sea came under repeated attack Wednesday, leaving the vessel "not under command" in an assault suspected to have been carried out by Yemen's Houthi rebels, the British military said. Few details were immediately available about the attack, though it comes during the Houthi's months long campaign targeting ships over the ongoing Israel-Hamas war in the Gaza Strip. The attack saw men on small boats first open fire with small arms some 140 kilometers west of the rebel-held Yemeni port city of Hodeida, the British military's United Kingdom Maritime Trade Operations center (UKMTO) said. Three projectiles also hit the ship, it added. It wasn't clear if that meant drones or missiles. —AP

The filing Tuesday in Los Angeles brought to an apparent end a celebrity coupling — or at least the second installment of it — that dazzled from the very heights of the pop culture firmament and emblazoned countless tabloid covers. The pair became known, even before such power-couple portmanteaus were ubiquitous, as "Bennifer." Court records showed Lopez filed the petition Tuesday in Los Angeles Superior Court. The news was first reported by the TMZ website. TMZ reported further that Lopez listed the date of separation as 26 April, 2024. It added that she did not mention any prenuptial agreement. —AP

Kyiv targets Moscow in largest drone attacks

MOSCOW, 21 AUG
Moscow came under one of the largest attacks yet by Ukrainian drones since the start of fighting in 2022, Russian authorities reported Wednesday, saying they destroyed all of those headed toward the capital. Russia downed 45 Ukrainian drones overnight, the Ministry of Defence said. It said 11 were destroyed over the Moscow region, 23 over the Bryansk region, six over Belgorod, three over Kaluga and two over Kursk. "This was one of the biggest

attempts of all time to attack Moscow using drones," Moscow Mayor Sergey Sobyenin said on his Telegram channel. He said strong defenses around the capital made it possible to shoot down all the drones before they could hit their intended targets. Some Russian social media channels shared videos of drones apparently being destroyed by air defense systems, which then set off alarms. Alexander Bogomaz, the Governor of the Bryansk region, which borders

Ukraine, reported a "mass" attack on his region but that 23 drones were destroyed. Ukraine has targeted oil refineries and airfields in an attempt to weaken Russia's fighting potential, and also has targeted the capital several times. The drone attacks come as Ukrainian forces are continuing to push into Russia's western Kursk region. The raising incursion into Russia has raised morale in Ukraine with its surprising success and changed the dynamic of the fighting. —AP

Ukraine bans Russian Orthodox church

KYIV, 21 AUG
Ukraine has adopted a law to ban religious groups linked to Moscow in a move targeting the Ukrainian Orthodox Church, which the government has accused of complicity in Russia's full-scale invasion of Ukraine. "This is a historic vote. Parliament approved a legislation which bans a branch of the aggressor country in Ukraine," she wrote on Telegram. Ukrainians are Orthodox Christians but the faith has split between the Ukrainian Orthodox Church (UOC), and independent Orthodox Church of Ukraine. Courtesy, Al Jazeera

Putin makes surprise visit to Chechnya after 13 years

MOSCOW, 21 AUG
Russian President Vladimir Putin and Chechen leader Ramzan Kadyrov have inspected Chechen troops and volunteers preparing to fight in Ukraine in Putin's first visit to the North Caucasus region since 2011. The surprise trip comes as Moscow fights to push Ukrainian forces out of its Kursk region two weeks after they crossed the border in the largest invasion of Russia.

"As long as we have men like you, we are absolutely, absolutely invincible," Putin told soldiers at the Russian Special Forces University, a training school in Chechnya's Gudermes, according to a transcript on the Kremlin's website. Kyiv's incursion across its northern border has been an embarrassment for Putin and his army, even as Russian forces continue their steady advances on the front line in eastern Ukraine. —Courtesy, Al Jazeera

CHICAGO, 21 AUG
Americans are ready for a "better story" with Kamala Harris as their president, Barack Obama has asserted, as he made a forceful case for her, saying they don't want "four more years of bluster and bumbling and chaos" under her opponent Donald Trump. Former president Obama, in his speech to the Democratic National Convention Tuesday night, remembered choosing his former vice president, Joe Biden, 16 years ago and recognised his friend's accomplishments as Biden passed the torch to his running mate, Harris. "America is ready for a new chapter. America's ready for a better story. We are ready for a President Kamala Harris. And Kamala Harris is ready for the job," Obama said amidst applause from the audience. "History will remember Joe Biden as a pres-

ident who defended democracy at a moment of great danger. I am proud to call him my president, but even prouder to call him my friend. Now the torch has been passed. Now it's up to all of us to fight for the America we believe in," Obama, the first black American president, said in his prime-time address to the convention. He also levied personal attacks, calling Trump a "78-year-old billionaire who has not stopped whining about his problems since he rode his golden escalator nine years ago." —AP

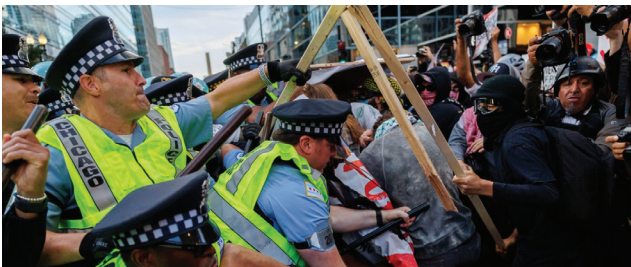
Trump campaigns to 'make America safe again'

HOWELL, 21 AUG
Former President Donald Trump pledged to "Make America Safe Again" while campaigning in Michigan as the Democrats who gathered in Chicago to nominate Kamala Harris branded him a career criminal. As part of a battleground campaign swing designed to counter the Democratic National Convention, Trump stood alongside sheriff's deputies in the city of Howell and tarred Harris, a former San Francisco district attorney and California attorney general, as the "ringleader" of a "Marxist attack on law enforcement" across the country. "Kamala Harris will deliver

crime, chaos, destruction and death," Trump said in one of many generalizations about an America under Harris. "You'll see levels of crime that you've never seen before. ... I will deliver law, order, safety and peace." Trump has sought in recent weeks to blunt the enthusiasm that Harris has attracted since President Joe Biden ended his reelection campaign and endorsed her. That has involved both dark predictions about what electing Harris would mean for the country and efforts by Trump's advisers to set up events where he can try to draw specific policy contrasts. On Tuesday in Michigan, the subject was crime and public safety. —AP

Protesters clash with police in Chicago

CHICAGO, 21 AUG
More than a dozen pro-Palestinian demonstrators were arrested Tuesday during a protest that began outside the Israeli consulate and spilled out onto the surrounding streets on the second night of the Democratic National Convention. The intense confrontations with officers began minutes into the demonstration, after some protesters — many dressed in black, their faces covered — charged at a line of

police that had blocked the group from marching. Officers carrying wooden clubs shouted "move" and penned some demonstrators in on the street. —AP

Hezbollah fires over 50 rockets at Golan Heights

JERUSALEM, 21 AUG
Lebanon's Hezbollah has launched more than 50 rockets, hitting a number of private homes in the Israeli-annexed Golan Heights. The attack on Wednesday came a day after US Secretary of State Antony Blinken met with fellow mediators Egypt and Qatar as he pressed ahead with the latest diplomatic mission to secure a cease-fire in the war in Gaza, even as Hamas and Israel signaled that challenges remain. Hamas in a new statement called the latest proposal pre-

sented to it a "reversal" of what it agreed to previously and accused the US of acquiescing to what it called "new conditions" from Israel. There

was no immediate US response. First responders in Golan Heights said they treated a 30-year-old man who was moderately wounded with shrapnel injuries in Wednesday's attack. One house was engulfed in flames, and fire fighters said they prevented a bigger tragedy by stopping a gas leak. Blinken ends latest visit without a cease-fire US Secretary of State Antony Blinken ended his ninth visit to the Middle East since the war in Gaza began without

securing a cease-fire deal, warning on Tuesday that "time is of the essence" even as Hamas and Israel signalled that challenges remain. After meetings in fellow mediating countries Egypt and Qatar, Blinken said that because Israel has accepted a proposal the focus turns to doing everything possible to "get Hamas on board". There has been added urgency to reach a deal after the recent targeted killings of militant leaders of Hamas and Hezbollah in Iran and Lebanon, both attributed to Israel. —AP

Suspected serial killer escapes from custody in Kenya

NAIROBI, 21 AUG
A manhunt is under way in Kenya after the escape from a Nairobi police cell of a man police claim had confessed to murdering 42 women after dismembered bodies were found in a quarry. Collins Jumaisi Khalusha, 33, described by police as a "vampire, a psychopath" after

his arrest on 15 July, broke out on Tuesday morning along with 12 undocumented Eritrean migrants. Khalusha had appeared in a court in the Kenyan capital on Friday, when the magistrate ordered him to be held for 30 more days to enable police to complete their investigations. Courtesy, Al Jazeera

Yacht that sank off Sicily was celebrating tech magnate's acquittal

PORTICELLO, 21 AUG
Police divers resumed searching for six people believed trapped in the hull of a superyacht that sank in deep seas off Sicily, including a British tech magnate who was celebrating his recent acquittal on fraud charges with the people who had defended him at trial. The luxury sailboat, off Porticello near Palermo, was some 50 metres underwater — far deeper than most recreational divers are certified for and a depth that requires special precautions. Recovery

crews could only stay for 12-minute shifts, a measure that slowed their efforts to reach the cramped inside of the wreck. Fire rescue officials have said the six other passengers will be considered missing until they are located in the wreckage. They include tycoon Mike Lynch, who was once hailed as Britain's king of technology and was cleared in June of fraud and conspiracy charges in a US federal trial related to Hewlett Packard's USD 11 billion takeover of his company, Autonomy Corp. Also unaccounted for are

Christopher Morvillo, one of Lynch's lawyers, and Jonathan Bloomer, a chairman at Morgan Stanley International and the former head of the Autonomy audit committee who testified in Lynch's defence. The outing was intended at least in part as a celebration of Lynch's acquittal and a "looking forward to what was coming next," said Reid Weingarten, a Washington attorney and a member of Lynch's defense team who was not on the yacht. The divers hadn't been able to access the below-deck cab-

ins because they were blocked by furniture that had shifted during the violent storm. Luca Cari, a Spokesman for the rescue teams, said the search was proceeding much more slowly than another big shipwreck in Italy, the 2012 Costa Concordia cruise ship that flipped on its side off Tuscany's coast, because of the depth of the wreck and the limited space divers have to maneuver. Some of the people who stood by Lynch throughout the ordeal were on board, including Morvillo, the lawyer, who Weingarten worked with. —AP

Rupee plunges 14 paise to 83.91 against US dollar

MUMBAI, 21 AUG

The Indian rupee nosedived 14 paise to 83.91 (provisional) against the US dollar on Wednesday amid unabated outflow of foreign capital and volatile domestic equity markets. Forex traders said a weak American currency and lower level of crude prices, however, cushioned the local unit at lower level. At the interbank foreign exchange, the rupee opened weak at 83.79 and touched the intraday low of 83.94 against the greenback. The unit finally settled at 83.91 (provisional) against the dollar, registering a loss of 14 paise from its previous days' closing level of 83.77. The rupee settled 10 paise higher at 83.77 against the American currency on Tuesday, a day after gaining 8 paise. Anuj Choudhary, Research Analyst at Sharekhan by BNP Paribas, said the rupee declined on recovery in US dollar index and US treasury yields. "FI outflows also weighed on the rupee. However, weak crude oil prices cushioned the downside."—PTI

Gold remains flat at ₹74,150/10g; silver falls ₹150/kg

NEW DELHI, 21 AUG

Gold prices remained flat at Rs 74,150 per 10 grams in the national capital on Wednesday, according to the All India Sarafa Association. The yellow metal of 99.9 per cent purity had jumped Rs 1,400 to settle at Rs 74,150 per 10 grams in the previous session on Tuesday. However, silver prices declined Rs 150 to Rs 87,000 per kilogram against Rs 87,150 per kg in the previous close. Meanwhile, gold of 99.5 per cent purity also remained flat at Rs 73,800 per 10 grams. In the global market, Comex gold is trading at USD 2,544.50 per ounce, down by USD 6.10 per ounce. "Gold... still holding to trade above USD 2,500, after surging to fresh all-time highs on Tuesday amid the expectation of rate cuts from the US Federal Reserve," said Mohammed Imran, Research Analyst at Sharekhan by BNP Paribas. —PTI

Odysse Electric to expand operations to 150 cities by Sept

Amazon's India investments only to fill balance sheet losses: Goyal

He says growth of e-commerce is concerning as it hits retailers

NEW DELHI, 21 AUG

Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal on Wednesday questioned Amazon's announcement of USD 1 billion investment in India, saying the US retailer was not doing any great service to the Indian economy but filling up for the losses it had suffered in the country.

He said that their huge losses in India "smells of predatory pricing", which is not good for the country as it impacts crores of small retailers. Launching a report on 'Net Impact of e-commerce on Employment and Consumer Welfare in India' here, the minister lambasted the e-commerce companies, questioning their business model that has been impacting small retailers in the country.

"When Amazon says that we are going to invest a billion dollars in the country, we celebrate, and we forget that the billion dollars are not coming in for great service or investment to support the Indian economy."

They made a billion-dollar loss in their balance sheet that year, they had to fill in that

loss. "And how did that loss get caused, they paid Rs 1,000 crores to professionals. I do not know who these professionals are...I would love to know, which chartered accountants, professionals or lawyers get Rs 1,000 crores unless you are paying all the top lawyers to block them so that nobody can fight a case against you," the minister said. "Of course, I do not deny that technology will play its part, technology is a means to empower, to innovate, to meet consumer requirements, probably sometimes more efficiently, but we will have to see that it grows in an orderly fashion," he said. —PTI

Online vendors generated 15.8M jobs: Report

NEW DELHI, 21 AUG

Online vendors have generated 15.8 million jobs in India, including 3.5 million for women, with about 1.76 million retail enterprises participating in e-commerce activity, says a report released on Wednesday. The report 'Assessing the Net Impact of e-Commerce on Employment and Consumer Welfare in India' was launched by Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal. "Plugging in data from our survey, we estimate that online vendors generate 15.8 million jobs, including 3.5 million jobs for women," the report prepared by Pahlia India Foundation, a Delhi-based policy research institute, said. E-commerce, according to the report, has been a key driver of employment generation in India. On an average, online vendors employ 54 per cent more people and almost twice the number of female employees, compared to offline vendors. The report noted that two of the most widely-recognised contributions of e-commerce penetration in the retail sector are --growth in employment and improvements in consumer welfare. It said rather than displacing physical markets, e-commerce is expanding into new territories like tier 3 cities. —PTI

Hyundai to build Hydrogen Centre at IIT-M campus

CHENNAI, 21 AUG

Automaker Hyundai Motor is set to establish a dedicated Hydrogen Innovation Centre at an investment of Rs 180 crore at the Thaiyur campus of Indian Institute of Technology, Madras for research in hydrogen technology.

During the Tamil Nadu Investment Conclave held earlier in the day in the city, Chief Minister MK Stalin laid the foundation stone for the facility, which is to come up on a 65,000 sq ft plot of land at the Thaiyur campus of IIT Madras, located on the outskirts of Chennai. The investment of Rs 180 crore has been earmarked towards the development and construction of the facility. The partnership between Hyundai Motor India Ltd., State government backed investment promotion agency Guidance Tamil Nadu and IIT Madras aims to accelerate hydrogen ecosystem development and adoption in the coun-

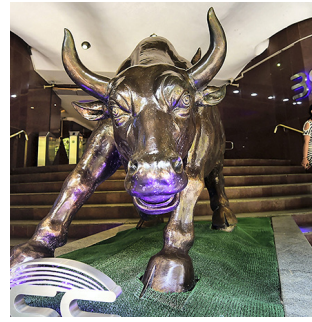

Economy can touch \$55T by 2047: IMF executive director

KOLKATA, 21 AUG

Executive director at the International Monetary Fund (IMF) Krishnamurthy Subramanian on Wednesday said that the size of the Indian economy has the potential to touch USD 55 trillion by 2047 if the growth rate in dollar terms remains at 12 per cent.

Speaking at a CII event here, Subramanian, the former chief economic advisor to the government from 2018 to 2021, said that inflation targeting since 2016 had helped the country average out the rate of price rise to five per cent. Before 2016, the average rate of inflation was 7.5 per cent, he said.

With a real growth of eight per cent, the nominal growth is expected to be 13 per cent with five per cent inflation rate, the economist said. "With rate of depreciation of the Indian currency to be less than one per cent vis-a-vis the dollar in the long run, the fundamentals of the economy will start to show up," he said.

In this context, Subramanian said that the real growth rate of India will be 12 per cent in dollar terms. According to

him, then the size of the economy will double every six years. "With the present size of the economy at USD 3.8 trillion, the possible size in 2047 could touch USD 55 trillion", he said.

Subramanian said that it is possible for India to grow at eight per cent in real terms. According to him, in advanced economies, investments have been saturated where productivity improvement will be the only source of growth.

The other cause for the country could grow at eight per cent is due to a greater formalisation of the economy. At present, one-half to two-thirds of the Indian economy is still in the informal sector, he said. —PTI

NMDC Steel's hot rolled coil production hits 1 MT-mark

NEW DELHI, 21 AUG

State-owned NMDC Steel Limited (NSL) on Wednesday announced producing 1 million tonnes of hot rolled coil (HRC) at its plant in Nagarnagar, Chhattisgarh in a year's time.

NMDC Steel Ltd, an entity demerged and formed from mining firm NMDC, owns and operates the 3 million-tonne Nagar Steel Plant -- referred as India's youngest steel unit -- and has been set up with an investment of around Rs 23,000 crore.

"NSL announces a landmark achievement of its production capabilities. Today, this ultra-modern plant has successfully produced 1 MT HRC four days ahead of the first anniversary of commencement of HR coil production," the company said in a statement.

On 21 July, 2024, the company had achieved the production of 1.5 MT of hot metal from its blast furnace and produced 1 MT of liquid steel from the steel making shop (SMS) on 11 August.

Both milestones were reached in less than a year from the commencement of production, the company said.

The company's CMD Amitava Mukherjee said, "Achieving 1 MnT of Hot Rolled Coil (HRC) ahead of schedule is a testament to the dedication, expertise, and hard work of our entire dedicated team."

This achievement not only sets a new standard within the PSU sector, but also stands strong against industry benchmarks. We remain focused on sustaining this momentum and continuing to lead with quality and efficiency." —PTI

Gem, jewellery exports drop 21.9% in July: GJEPC

MUMBAI, 21 AUG

The overall gem and jewellery exports witnessed a 21.93 per cent year-on-year decline in July to USD 1,665.4 million (Rs 13,922.03 crore) on account of dampening of consumer demand following global unrest, Gem and Jewellery Export Promotion Council (GJEPC) has said.

According to data released by GJEPC -- the apex body for the gems and jewellery industry in India -- the overall exports in the category in July 2023 stood at Rs USD 2,170.71 million.

"The exports are mainly affected due to decline in demand following geopolitical disturbance in key markets like the US and China. The demand in the China market has drastically slowed down due to a strug-

gling economy," GJEPC Chairman Vipul Shah told PTI.

The overall export of cut and polished diamonds (CPD) declined 21.34 per cent in July to USD 907.67 million from USD 1,174.41 million in the year-ago period.

Gold jewellery exports also witnessed a 10.53 per cent decline in July to USD 530.38 million compared to USD 603.12 million in the same period of last year. —PTI

Decathlon to invest ₹932 cr in next 5 yrs

ICICI Securities has settled with market watchdog Sebi a case pertaining to alleged violation of regulatory norms after paying Rs 69.82 lakh.

A settlement application was submitted to Sebi in connection with the inspection of books and records for the merchant banking activities of the company, ICICI Securities said in a regulatory filing. The observations were primarily related to the due diligence process to be followed by the company as a merchant banker, it said. The company had submitted an application for settlement under Settlement Regulations in respect of the aforementioned matter with a view to avoid any protracted

proceedings arising from Sebi's show cause notice, it said. Following the payment, a settlement order dated August 20, 2024 passed by Sebi has been received by the company on the same day, it added.

Meanwhile, ICICI Securities is seeking regulatory clearance for delisting from bourses. As per the scheme of arrangement, shareholders of ICICI Securities will get 67 shares of ICICI Bank for every 100 shares they hold. —PTI
